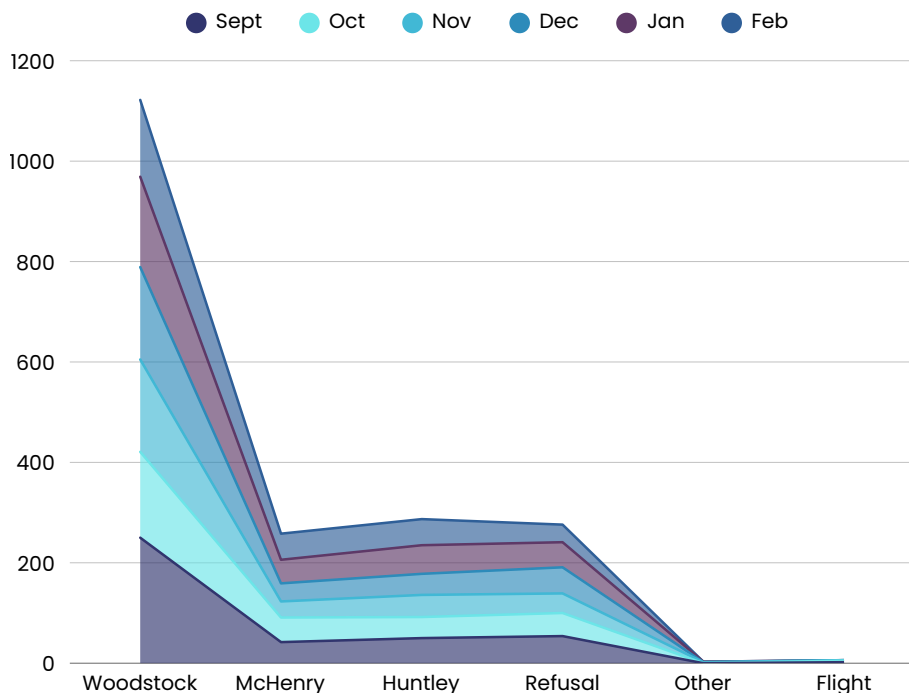

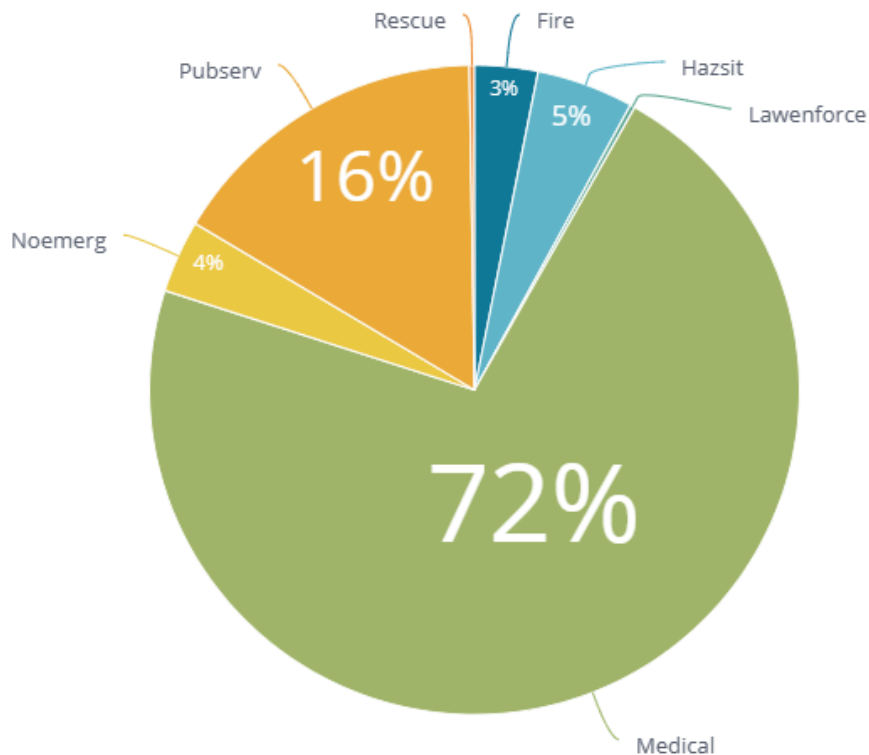

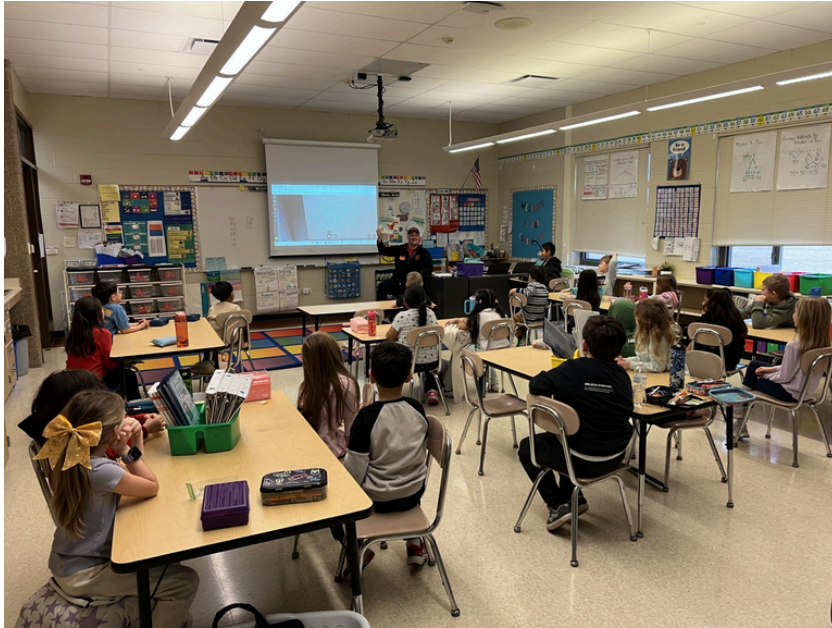

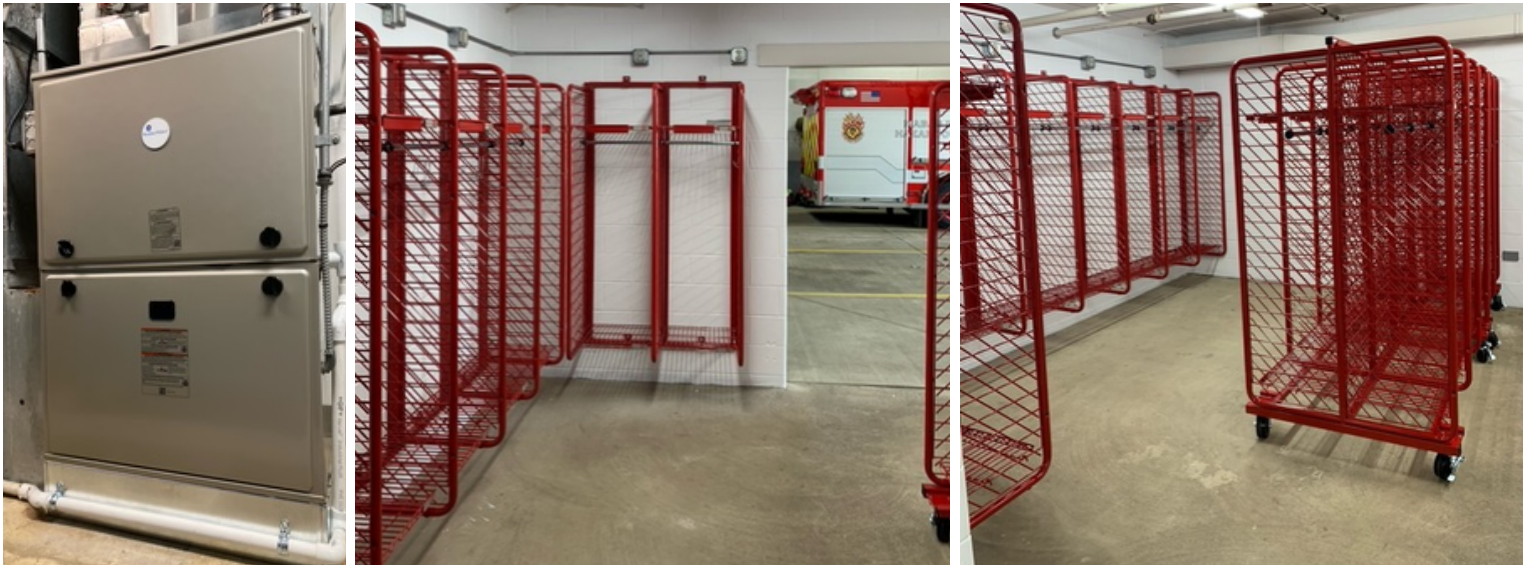

MAJOR INCIDENT SUPPORT

- Responded to multiple incidents including structure fires in Woodstock, Cary, and Marengo, a rollover crash in Marengo, and a brush fire in Woodstock
- Issued a formal news release for a structure fire in Cary and a vehicle crash in Huntley
- Provided on scene support and follow up public information messaging for several incidents, including a brush fire in Woodstock and other responses requiring public safety messaging



PUBLIC INFORMATION

- Created and posted over 20 social media updates
- Covered personnel recognition, community events, public safety messaging, fire weather conditions, and department activities
- Coordinated media coverage with WGN TV during two separate events, including a feature segment with Macyn's Jars and coverage during a Cary awards ceremony
